

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE COURSE “Fall Superintendent’s Conference, 2010 – Leadership for the New Digital Learning Environment”. If you would like to receive one graduate credit for this course, you need to do the following:

1. Fill out completely the enrollment form enclosed with these instructions and return it to the registration area to a WASDA representative while you are at the conference. Credit is optional and this is the only way to register to receive the credit and a grade. Payment can be made by check, charge, cash or we will bill you at home to take to your district for payment. DESCRIPTION: Are you prepared to lead your district into the digital learning age? As superintendents, what is your vision for realizing the potential that technology offers and your students demand? The format of this Fall Conference course has been changed to give WASDA members an in-depth one day workshop to help prepare them as leaders in the rapidly approaching age of digital learning. Attendees will hear one of the nation's top educators and thinkers on the subject of leadership for the new digital learning environment.

OBJECTIVES:

-To share ideas for implementation in the participant's school district during school year 2010-2011.

To have participants consider everything from budget implications to technology changes and their impact on schools.

OUTLINE OF CONTENT:

-Full attendance at the full two day conference (pre-conference activities and the reception on Wednesday evening is optional for credit participation).

-Written short summary report to be turned into the instructor no later than October 1, 2010, the ending date of this course.

METHODOLOGY:

Lecture, small group workshops, videos, ITV, LCD presentations, overheads, large and small group sharing sessions and other related teaching and presentation aids will all be covered in the various lectures, large and small group work.

ASSIGNMENTS AND REQUIREMENTS:

-Full attendance at the two day conference

-A short written report addressing application ideas gained at the conference.

GRADING/METHODS OF EVALUATION:

Participation and written work should be done at the highest standard of quality and at the graduate level and needs to include the following:

A-100% attendance – participation in small and large group discussions and sharing sessions; concise written report with multiple application ideas gained specifically participating in the activities chosen.

AB-100% attendance – 90% completion of the above assignment, participation levels, etc.

B-100% attendance – 85% of the above assignment, participation levels, etc.

BC –100% attendance – 80% of the above assignment, participation levels, etc.

C –100% attendance – 75% of the above assignment, participation levels, etc.

If below a C is to be awarded, it means that the participant did not complete the written assignment on time and in a satisfactory manner. 100% attendance is required in order to receive credit for the conference.
